Better Futures Start Here

- Neu-Life is one of the state's only youthserving agencies accredited as a Child and Youth Development program from the National Council on Accreditation (COA).
- Our priority is to give our young people the skills and resources they need to achieve their best possible life. We take a holistic, researchbased, community-centric approach that builds skills and resiliency while exposing our youth to opportunities in the larger world.

23+ Years of Creating a New Path for Urban Youth

- We serve more than 3,000 unduplicated young people annually.
- Our families live in two of Milwaukee's most distressed zip codes where 2/3 of children live in poverty.
- 100% of programs are provided at no out-of-pocket costs to families.
- 85% of Neu-Life staff are people of color.
- 64% of our staff are alums of Neu-Life Communit Development.

The Youth Innovation Center Model

Our teen worker model is recognized as a best practice throughout the city, and the Youth Work

Innovation Center is an expansion of that program.

We engage middle and high school students in project-based programming to help prepare them for the workforce while training the next generation of Youth Workers.

Tough Times Don't End at Adulthood







Things don't always go well for our young people as they graduate from the circle of nurturing support they find at Neu-Life.

- •For some, losing the day-to-day safety net of positive mentors and peers means they don't have the support they need to say "No" to unhealthy choices.
- •For others, the reality of providing for themselves leaves them stressed and overwhelmed. They work hard, but they're exhausted and struggle to find a s affordable place to live.



Young Adults in Milwaukee Need Support

- 24% of Milwaukee's African american 16-24- year-olds in 2020 were "disconnected" -- neither working nor in school -- compared to 7% of white 16-24 year olds in Milwaukee and 12.6% of all young adults nationally.
- Such disconnection affects the ability of young adults to build financial stability and satisfying careers.
- Nationally, 48% of Black and 43% of Latinx young adult census respondents reporting difficulty meeting basic monthly expenses in 2020-2022 in contrast to 31% of white young adults.
- Supporting our Milwaukee young people as they transition to adulthood is critical to helping them build and sustain thriving lives.

NeuVue: Supportive Housing Model



- Mentorship
- Financial education and counseling
- Mental health support
- Supportive community of peers
- Post secondary education and career guidance

NeuVue: 6-story Supportive Housing & Multi-Use Space

- 36 studio, one- & two-bedroom housing units
- Indoor gymnasium for athletic programs
- Expanded youth programming spaces
- Restaurant (partner operated) and event space
- Administrative offices for Neu-Life staff
- Rentable office spaces for non-profit partners
- Rentable shared spaces for one-time use
- Onsite Parking




The 106,050 square foot development is a self-sustaining multiuse space that will support young adults and help expand youth programming.


NeuVue: Positive Community Culture


- Housing units will be dedicated for Neu-Life youth workers ages 18-24
- In addition, we will also have housing units available for youth workers from partner orgs, young professionals or students aligned with our community culture
- All renters will agree to NeuVue's community guidelines and engaging with our supportive services











Neu-Vue will expand two of Neulife's amazing programs

Opportunities for FarmFork

- Open a new commercial learning kitchen modeled after MATC's Culinary School
- Increase the number of Neu-Life youth participating in culinary arts education and training
- Plant rooftop production gardens that Farmfork youth will tend to and harvest
- Practice culinary and hospitality skills in the first floor Café and rooftop space

Opportunities for NeuMedia:

- Expand our NeuMedia program from one to three learning studios
- Increase the number of Neu-Life youth learning media and production skills that will prepare them for jobs in a variety of creative fields.









Expanded Youth Programming: Neu-Life Athletics

NeuVue will create an opportunity to:

- Have a recreation space for our youth in our sports programs (serves over 1,000 unduplicated youth a year)
- Have a space for other organizations to rent the gym for sports and recreation programs (serving/reaching even more youth)
- A flexible large gym event space that can also be rented for events such as fundraisers, galas, award events and special events



NeuVue: Centrally Located Near Educational & Job Opportunities

Located at 12th & Cherry Streets, NeuVue will be within walking distance to:

- Educational opportunities at MATC and Marquette University
- Downtown job opportunities including Fiserv Forum
- Milwaukee County social services and mental health services
- Neu-Life's main youth center





Timeline for Project:

Fall 2025- Break Ground *Goal Target*: \$6 million raised of the total \$13.5 project goal

Fall 2025- Fall 2027- Construction Timeline *Goal Target*: Raise remaining \$7.5 million for the project
